

ROCKY MOUNTAIN GASTROENTEROLOGY DIABETIC MEDICATION INSTRUCTIONS

For Outpatient Procedures

It is important to keep your blood sugar controlled when you are having an outpatient procedure.

These are general guidelines, so please call your healthcare provider who manages your diabetes for questions.

Check your blood sugar continuously throughout the preparation day, at bedtime of the preparation day, and the morning of the procedure.



If your blood sugar is less than 60, you may take a glucose tablet and/or call your health care provider for directives.

INSULIN & ORAL CONTROLLED DIABETES:

THE DAY BEFORE YOUR PROCEDURE:

- Take your medications as usual.
- Be sure to drink all the clear liquids necessary to maintain your blood sugar

THE EVENING BEFORE YOUR PROCEDURE:

- **Oral Medications:** continue usual dosage until midnight
- Insulin: take half of your usual amount of evening insulin

THE MORNING OF YOUR PROCEDURE:

- Oral Medications & Insulin: Do not take any pills or insulin the day of your procedure
- Insulin pump: Discontinue the bolus function 4 hours prior to your arrival time.
 If your blood sugar is in an acceptable range, decrease the basal function to 50% of your normal rate.
